Item g.1 Special Education Budget – Ryan Putnam

Superintendent Bowyer introduced Ryan Putnam, Chief Financial Officer and Superintendent of Business. Item I.1 Coordinator's Report – L. Coghlan

March 22, 2016 – Program Support Teacher Meeting

Staff of Community Advantage Rehabilitation provided a presentation on Fine Motor Skills and how to identify, remediate and prevent fine motor difficulties in the primary classroom. Teachers were provided with valuable pre-printing activities and practical

ways to include helpful visual and fine motor strategies in the classroom. Program Support Teachers then participated in an IEP audit, using the IEP checklist. In small groups, Program Support teachers reviewed IEPs focusing on specific areas such as Student profile, Assessment Data, Student Strengths/Needs, Accommodations, Equipment, Provincial Assessments, Human Resources and IEP Team. We will provide the opportunity for IEP audits at future PST meetings in an effort to continually improve Individual Education Plans.

April 22, 2016 – A Robotics event will take place at CEC Conference Centre. Each Family of Schools will send an elementary team to participate in this event. This is a great opportunity for students to have fun and learn more about coding and robotics.

During the month of April, elementary schools part of the Dwyer Family of Schools will participate in the "Students with Assistive Technology Transition Trip". Beginning this Wednesday, students with Assistive Technology will participate in Secondary classes, receive an introduction to One Note from A.T. Specialist Kristi Norris, and meet with Program Support Teacher, Gianna Tessarolo, to learn about what Assistive Technology looks like in secondary school.

DCDSB and Parents as Partners is proud to present our 'Learning with a Difference Conference' May 25th. We are looking forward to our Keynote presentation from Lesley Andrew, as well as participating in break-out sessions that explore different topics such as Assistive Technology, Resiliency, Pathways (both from Elementary to Secondary, and Secondary to Post-Secondary), and Organizational Skills.

Mental Health Update:

April is a busy month for mental health training. A Mental Health First Aid session for Secondary staff will take place on April 7 & 8. Applied Suicide Intervention Skills (ASIST) Training session for Elementary staff will take place on April 20 & 21. Two safeTALK sessions for staff will be offered on the April 15 PD day. Several other sessions being offered on the April 15 PD day will focus on mental health and well-being.

The parent safeTALK session unfortunately did not take place in March, as there was not enough interest to fill a session. We've invited those parents who indicated interest to join with staff for an evening session on May 26, 2016.

Congratulations to Max Travis who was our Curriculum Chair of Program Support at Msgr. Paul Dwyer C.H.S. He was recently promoted to the position of Vice Principal at All Saints C.S.S. We have posted for a new Curriculum Chair.

April 15 PA Day – In collaboration with its affiliates, the Durham Catholic District School Board is planning a system-wide Professional Activity Day for elementary and secondary staff, including Educational Assistants, Designated Early Childhood Educators, Teachers, Secretaries, Student Services, Principals and Vice Principals. The intent of this day will be to provide participants with an opportunity to participate in professional learning through a series of workshops (either 2 half day or 1 full day) provided by Board staff and partner agencies on topics related to Ministry and Board priorities. Many of the approximately 150 workshops being offered will be facilitated by Student Services staff members.

The UP Math program - Ultimate Potential Math has had significant success at Monsignor John Pereyma C.S.S. The Pereyma teachers work with their feeder schools to determine which students would benefit the most from a learning strategies class in Math in first semester of grade 9. Students meet with tremendous success when they take Grade 9 applied math in second semester.

Next year, all schools are expected to run an UP Math program and will be supported in this regard. Professional learning and sharing has already begun.

Superintendent Bowyer asked Diane Mullane, Mental Health Leader, to provide information about a collaborative project with DDSB and Durham Region Health Department to create a resource for parents to support the well-being of young people transitioning from Elementary to Secondary. A "final draft" of the parent resource has been created, and there is a request for feedback from stakeholder groups, including parents and staff members. Once the draft is finalize, a polished resource will be created for distribution to parents. We are hoping that, through your channels, you may be able to help us get some of this feedback. The document and a short feedback questionnaire was shared with SEAC by email on April 6. with the request to share with parent groups. Kerry's Place Autism Services:

Girls Group: This group is for girls ages 10- 15 years.

Social Club for Kids: Back by popular demand - 2 times slots are available for kids who want to get together to play games, do LEGO, learn new skills and make friends.

Sibling Support Group: This is a monthly support group for siblings of children with ASD. The group is for siblings ages 10 years and up.

Employment Works Canada is one of three new Worktopia programs that have been designed to improve the employment futures of young adults with ASD. It is a 12-week employment preparedness training program for individuals ages 15 to 29 who are no longer attending school and are seeking opportunities to develop the skills necessary to obtain meaningful and sustainable paid employment. The program incorporates peer and co-worker support, and uses adult learning principles to develop and practice social, communication and employment skills in a variety of workplace settings and teams. It occurs two times per week for 2.5 hours each session.
