G.Presentations

g.1 Mental Health and Addictions Strategy – D. Mullane

Diane Mullane, Manager, Mental Health Initiatives/Mental Health Leader presented data from the National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH) with regards to drug/alcohol use in children grades 7-12 which showed a significant decline in the last 20 years. She also presented 2017 data from the Durham Region. This survey is completed every 2 years and Durham's 2019 data should be available soon, hopefully continuing the decline. Diane shared information and a short video from the annual DYDAC (Durham Youth Drug Awareness Committee) Conference where students from across Durham Region come to learn more about the effects of drugs and alcohol. DCDSB schools are also participating in their own drug awareness initiatives with funding provided by the Board and the Ministry (e.g. high school students are presenting what they learned at the DYDAC Conference to grade 7 and 8 students).

g.2 Assessments – J. Bowyer

Superintendent Bowyer and Dr. Jessica Abrams, Manager, Psychological and Speech Language Services/Chief Psychologist, provided an overview of DCDSB's comprehensive internal and external assessment models (approximate complement, wait lists, what each assessment might look like) and responded to questions as they arose.

L. Staff Reports

I.1 Coordinator's Report – D. Mullane for C. Plouffe

Students with Assistive Technology Transition Trip (SWATTT)

Over the past few weeks, all 7 of DCDSB's Secondary Schools welcomed gr. 8 students with Assistive Technology from their feeder elementary schools. The sessions were approximately 2 hours in length and included a Kahoot trivia game, Scavenger Hunt of the school, Self-Advocacy Scenarios, Student Mentor Voice, AT @ Secondary and of course, a snack!! The SWATT trips were supported by the secondary and elementary Program Support Teachers, Intermediate Guidance Teachers, the Assistive Technology Team and Student Services Consultant. SWATT is a valuable piece to support a successful transition to secondary school and feedback from staff and students has been very positive.

I.2 Mental Health Report – D. Mullane

DCPIC hosted their mental health and wellbeing parent conference on Saturday, Feb 8 with Dr. Patrick Carney as the keynote speaker. The event was well-attended, and the feedback was very positive.

School Mental Health Ontario recently invited DCDSB teachers to participate in piloting a new online resource called **Faith and Wellness: A Daily Mental Health Resource**. This is the OECTA endorsed, faith-based version of a secular resource that is currently available, designed to equip teachers with practical tools to enhance mental health skills, attitudes knowledge and habits as part of their daily practice in Catholic Schools. 19 DCDSB teachers are currently participating in this pilot.

While the current climate has meant reduced PD and fewer meetings to share information with educators and administrators, there is still a lot going on behind the scenes. The student DYDAC and TAMI groups are running amazing initiatives in their schools, and are hoping that they will be able to move forward with many activities scheduled for March and early April including the second TAMI Intermediate Summit on March 24, an ASIST Tune-UP on April 2, a presentation by Dr. Kristen McLeod on the April 3 PD day as well as a Sharing of Excellence series in April. Student Services has also scheduled a safeTALK workshop for parents on May 7 and are working on setting a date for another Cannabis and Vaping event for parents.

Save the Date: The community Youth Suicide Prevention Action Group has scheduled a "Community Launch" for some of the resources that Student Services has previously shared with SEAC, (including a Suicide Prevention postcard and walletcard, and Community Postvention Guidelines). This free event will take place on the morning of May 20 at the Pope Francis Conference Centre and will feature Valéry Brosseau, Mental health speaker, writer and advocate.

I.3 Superintendent's Report – J. Bowyer

In the past, the Ministry of Education budgets were generally released at the end of March. The Ministry of Education has informed Boards to expect the 2020-2021 budgets around mid-April. As has been past practice, during the April SEAC meeting, Superintendent Putnam will share the Board budget priorities and Superintendent Bowyer will share the proposed special education budget and any announcement for Special Education.

As part of the collective agreement with APSSP, there was the inclusion of Local Priority Funds to add additional staff. DCDSB received additional funding for approximately 0.6 staff. Superintendent Bowyer will be meeting with APSSP tomorrow to discuss DCDSB's proposal. The money in the previous collective agreement went toward Speech Language Services and when the money was not renewed last year, the position was reduced.

Last week, Superintendent Bowyer applied to the Ministry of Education for the subsidy for teachers to take the Additional Qualification Course on ASD. The subsidy is for three years, but will be based on whatever amount DCDSB is approved for. It will be handed out on a first come, first served basis.

This week is Social Workers Week. DCDSB will be acknowledging the work of Social Workers tomorrow across the Board.

On March 21, schools will be celebrating Down Syndrome Awareness Day. On April 2, schools will be celebrating Autism Awareness Day.
