 - 2.2.1. School Year Calendar for 2022-2023 Superintendent Hader Ibrahim

Superintendent Ibrahim provided a brief overview of what the calendar for the next school year would look like. He presented two calendar options for the 2022-2023 school year that included the dates Christmas and March breaks would fall on. He suggested the Committee discuss and provide their consensus on which calendar they would prefer so that it could be brought back to Admin Counsel for consideration.

The majority of the Committee opted for the 2nd calendar in which the Christmas break would commence on December 26, 2022, the return to school date would be January 9, 2023, and the March break would start on March 10, 2023. 2.2.2. Superintendent Susie Lee-Fernandes provided an update on the 1st set of Special Education Review leadership sub-committee meetings. The sub-committees are composed of 4 committees, each of which involves Board level staff as well as representation from different groups working in schools.

Superintendent Lee-Fernandes informed that due to supply shortage challenges, the 2nd set of meetings may have to be canceled and in response to the current circumstances, each subcommittee has narrowed its areas of focus and structures for the current school year.

2.5. Staff Reports

2.5.1. Coordinator's Report - Christine Congrady

Christine reported the following:

- Elementary Term 2 IEPs will be going home with report cards on February 7th
- Secondary Quad 2 Report Cards will go home on February 7th as well.
- New PST Mentoring continued in January with an Ask Your Student Services Coordinator drop-in session
- The Friendship Lab 10-week winter session began January 10th
- Sharing of Excellence Series in January included the training on the Principles of ABA: Individualized Programming

2.5.2. Mental Health Leader's Report - Shelley Phoenix

Dr. Jessica Abrams reported on behalf of Shelley Phoenix.

Over 100 DCDSB staff members attended the staff wellness information sessions to learn more about two virtual mental health programs: Bounce Back and MindBeacon. Both of these programs are for adults and older adolescents. Presentations were recorded for staff who were unable to attend.

On January 26 many schools participated in the Bell Let's Talk Day to raise awareness about mental health and help reduce the stigma associated with mental illness.

The Mental Health First Aid - Supporting Youth virtual session which was scheduled for January and the SafeTALK session in February had to be canceled due to staff shortages and Covid-19 restrictions. The Board hopes to be able to offer these sessions again in the upcoming months.

Planning for the evening event for Black Mental Health Day which falls on March 7th is underway. A keynote speaker and some student talent to take part. More details; including promotional material is forthcoming.

The Durham Youth Drug Awareness Committee (DYDAC) which DCDSB is represented on, is in the process of creating two modules for grade 6 to 12 classrooms in lieu of the Annual Secondary Student Conference. The focus is on alcohol, cannabis, vaping and

the connection between substance abuse and mental health with speakers from Pinewood Centre of Lakeridge Health, Carea Community Health Centre, Durham District, and Durham Catholic District School Boards. The modules are expected to be ready for educators in mid-February.

In February the Staff Wellness Committee is hosting a Virtual Yoga class, a Winter Walk Day challenge, and a Christian Meditation session for staff with a focus on mind, body, and spirit.

2.5.3. Superintendent's Report - Susie Lee-Fernandes

Superintendent Lee-Fernandes informed that Anti-Black Racism and Anti-Discrimination training was provided for the Elementary School Administrative Assistants on January 21st. The central staff will receive this training on March 9th.

Superintendent Lee-Fernandes communicated that Chevoy Hickey, an additional Coach/Advocate for Black Students started on January 31st. This is a temporary position until June 2022. Kamille Morgan, Psychometrist in Psychological Services has also joined the Student Services Team.

2.6. Association Reports

Grandview Kids - S. Casola

Grandview Kids will be offering the Stepping Stones to School program for parents and caregivers of children registered with the Ontario Autism Program this February. This program is intended to help families prepare their children who are entering school for the first time.

Registration is open on GrandviewKids.ca under "I want to... register on My Community Hub."

The program reviews:

- Creating a vision and building relationships
- Participating in school meetings
- Developing Individual Education Plans
- School-Based Rehabilitation
- Parent Advocacy
- Guest Speakers will discuss their roles within the school boards and as caregivers

Grandview Kids Vaccine Clinic: The Paediatric Vaccine Clinic will be open on Saturdays in February. First and second doses of the COVID-19 vaccine are available for children (ages 5 to 11 years) and youth (12 to 17 years). Children do not need to be a client of Grandview Kids to attend, but registration is required. To register, families can visit GrandviewKids.ca. This clinic provides a safe, welcoming environment for all children, including those who may need a bit of extra time to receive their vaccines.

Integra - Executive Functioning and Emotion Regulation webinar This workshop provides participants with an understanding of the nature of executive functioning (higher-order thinking skills including planning, organization, and flexibility) for children with LDs in this area. 2.7.1. Letter from Waterloo Region DSB dated December 3, 2021

The letter, addressed to the Honourable Stephen Lecce, Minister of Education from Sara Penny, Chair of SEAC, Waterloo Region District School Board writing in support of Bill 172, An Act in Relation to Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder.
