2.1. Announcements

Superintendent Lee-Fernandes informed that the Student Services Department has a few significant staffing changes this year.

Superintendent Lee-Fernandes announced the resignation of Dr. Jessica Abrams, Senior Manager of Psychological and Speech-Language Services and Chief Psychologist. Dr. Abrams has accepted the position of Director of the Psychology Clinic at York University, providing clinical training to grad students. Dr. Abrams will be sincerely missed at DCDSB!

 - 2.3.1. Review of Priorities 2022-2023 Susie Lee-Fernandes

Superintendent Lee-Fernandes shared the following 5 key areas of the Special Education Plan that will be reviewed next year:

- •Standard 2.1: The Board's General Model for Special Education
- •Standard 2.8: Special Education Placements Provided by the Board
- •Standard 2.3: Early Identification Procedures and Intervention Strategies
- •Standard 2.5: Educational and Other Assessments
- •Standard 2.9: Individual Education Plans (IEPs)

As previously shared with the committee, the DCDSB has started the groundwork for Project Search with the goal of beginning the program for students with developmental and intellectual disabilities in September of 2023. The program will provide a postsecondary experience for students who continue with the Board up until the age of 21. The last year of secondary school will focus on their pathway and building up their skills in preparation for the workplace and community living.

The pilot, Therapeutic Recreation in Schools, ran at All Saints CSS this year in partnership with the Abilities Centre in Whitby. This was a great success and expansion to other secondary schools will continue.

The Durham Catholic School Board recently submitted two proposals to the Ministry for additional funding to support the transitions for students with disabilities:

- Project Search for approximately \$300,000 which will go towards staffing
- STEP Co-op and Job Coaches for approximately \$450,000 which will go towards enhancing and improving the program and fund for Job Coaches in all secondary schools.

Superintendent Lee-Fernandes also shared that the DCDSB is continuing to build educator and staff capacity around Anti-Racism, Anti-Discrimination, Culturally Responsive Pedagogy, Universal Design for Learning and the Right to Read Inquiry.

2.5. Staff Reports

2.5.1. Coordinator's Report - Christine Congrady

Christine reported the following:

- The Coordinators are currently attending transition meetings for new students who will be joining our schools in September 2022;
- The PST Mentoring program concludes this month with a final session on end of year and start-up procedures;
- Sharing of Excellence Series:
 - How to Use Token Economy participants learned about developing and using token economies with students
- Project SEARCH Update:
 - Upcoming meetings with the Abilities Centre and Durham Region
 - July 25-29th Conference in Baltimore, Maryland

Christine answered questions from the committee.

2.5.2. Mental Health Leader's Report - Diane Mullane

Staff Professional Development:

- As part of Child and Youth Mental Health Week in the first week of May, we hosted an after-school safeTALK (suicide alertness) session for interested staff. The session was full to capacity and well-received by those who attended.
- On June 2, the parent/caregiver community (as well as the community at large) was invited to participate in a safeTALK session hosted by Youth Suicide Prevention Durham.
 DCDSB provided the venue and one of the trainers. We hope to provide additional opportunities for parent mental health literacy, including safeTALK sessions, in the upcoming year.

The first session of the new Mental Health First Aid Supporting Youth (Virtual) was provided on May 18 and 19
 for a "gatekeeper" audience, which included school
 administrators, PSTs, Guidance Counsellors, and others. A
 summer session will be offered in early July, which is open to
 all staff members.

Staff Wellness Initiatives:

- On May 12, staff were invited to attend an after-school "Moment of Mindfulness" session hosted by our Mental Health Leader and one of our school Social Workers. This was part of our staff wellness initiatives.
- On June 2, we hosted a Cultural Wellness session with Angelique Benois from the Women's Multicultural Resource and Counselling Centre.
- We are currently working on an onboarding wellness package for new employees.

Support for Ukrainian Families:

- Over this past month, DCDSB has been engaging in discussions with our ESL consultants and Settlement Workers to talk about how the Board can support our families arriving from Ukraine.
- The Ukrainian Canadian Congress- Durham Branch, requested specific information for their website, which is intended to be a one-stop shop for newcomer families and those who support them. Here is the website link: <u>Support</u> <u>Newcomers</u>
- Should some students with trauma histories require mental health supports, this can be provided using translation services, if needed. In the meantime, we've shared some information with schools about how to welcome and support the needs of newcomer students, including recognizing when a student might be struggling. Diane Mullane, Senior Manager of Mental Health Initiatives/ Mental Health Leader shared this message with SEAC after her retirement was announced:

2.5.3. Superintendent's Report - Susie Lee-Fernandes

Superintendent Lee-Fernandes shared the two learning opportunities that will be held during the summer;

Learning Disabilities Association of Ontario (LDAO) Educators' Institute will be held on August 16th and 17th. This conference is open to the Special Education Team and Program Support Teachers. There are currently 18 attendees.

The Summer Institute for Educators will be held on August 25th and will provide a full day of learning on topics that include equity, mental health, classroom management, etc. A keynote will be on an equity-related topic and there will be an opportunity to purchase culturally relevant resources.

Superintendent Lee-Fernandes expressed her gratitude for the Committee's representation at SEAC this year. She also thanked and acknowledged the Student Services staff, Program Support Teachers, Educational Assistants, Principals and Vice Principals for all their hard work, dedication, and commitment to our students.
