"THAT the Durham Catholic District School Board approve "In Principle" the proposed program and boundary recommendations to bring to the Oshawa families of schools for community consultation during the 2022-23 school year."

Rationale

On January 24, 2022, the Board of Trustees received the Long-Term Accommodation Plan 2022-2026 (LTAP) report and approved the guiding principles and actions to be undertaken. Within the LTAP report, staff was directed to undertake an Oshawa program and boundary study, with recommendations for any potential changes to be identified for a community consultation and implementation review (any potential outcomes would be subject to the provision of new PARG guidelines from the Ministry of Education, and the removal of the current moratorium). The study would help to address potential program and service delivery models at one or more Catholic Schools in Oshawa which are being impacted by the increased growth in north Oshawa, and due to the Ministry of Education announcement in July of 2020 to replace Monsignor Paul Dwyer Catholic High School with a grade 7-12 school.

Board staff hired Watson and Associates Economists Ltd, who have worked with DCDSB in the past on Accommodation planning. This report summarizes the report provided by Watson and Associates titled "Oshawa attendance Area Review: Draft Options" (attached appendix).

Attendance Boundary Policy

In accordance with Board Policy PO-415 School Attendance Area, a proposed school boundary is developed for each Catholic Elementary and Secondary School located within the Board's jurisdiction. The development of boundaries is undertaken to create neighbourhood or community schools. The boundary of each school should be of a sufficient size to sustain the long-term operation of the school at a full or near full capacity level. The boundary can be associated with a program (i.e., FI; AMP).

Staff is required, through Policy, to report to the Board of Trustees with respect to proposed boundaries changes. The Board of Trustees approves "In Principle" so that when the community consultation process commences, the affected schools will have a draft set of boundaries to work from and provide comments on.

Following the meetings with the affected communities, and based on input from these communities, a final report on the proposed set boundaries is brought to the Board of Trustees for approval.

Boundary Review Process

- 1. Staff develop draft boundaries for review by Administrative Council;
- 2. The draft boundaries are brought forward to Trustees for Approval "In Principle";
- 3. Staff are directed to meet with the affected school communities to present the approved "In Principle" boundaries and receive public input;
- 4. Staff review all input and present the proposed final boundaries to the Board of Trustees for approval;
- 5. The Board of Trustees provides final approval to the boundaries;
- 6. Staff communicate the approved boundaries to all affected parents and guardians of students living within the school boundaries and communicate all changes to attendance.

ANALYSIS

Existing Enrolment and Boundaries

At present the Oshawa area has 10 regular track English elementary boundaries, 2 secondary boundaries, and 3 French Immersion boundaries. There are two out of Oshawa school boundaries (Holy Family and Good Shepherd) that need to be included in the study as they have students that attend Monsignor Paul Dwyer.



Overall, the utilization rate in Oshawa continues to remain strong at over 100%. This is mostly attributed to the growth in North Oshawa. The proposed new schools and additions, along with the current Oshawa study will provide some relief and direction on boundary and program reviews to help balance the utilization.

As part of this review the French Immersion (FI) programs of Oshawa are being considered to determine how best to balance the schools that offer the program with the pressures of the capacity at those schools. The existing FI programs currently have a total of 508 elementary students and that is expected to grow to > 550 by 2031. Two of the three dual track FI schools in Oshawa are well over capacity. There is no secondary FI offered within the City of Oshawa until the initiation of the FI program, currently identified to start at Monsignor Paul Dwyer High School in September of 2024.

The Ministry of Education has approved the 8-room addition for St. Anne C.S.; the replacement Monsignor Paul Dwyer High School (grades 7-12); and our Board has

approved accepting French Immersion students to Monsignor Paul Dwyer. These three significant capital and program initiatives are also being factored into the report.

Recommendations of the Report

Watson and Associates have provided the following three recommended options to take to the Oshawa community for consultation:

- 1. When the new replacement Dwyer secondary school is open, the Board will have a vacant building in Oshawa that could be used as a single-track grade 1-8 FI school. Or alternatively, the Board will also have a vacant building at Father Venini Catholic elementary school, which could also be used as a single-track grade 1-8 FI school. In this scenario the grade 7 and 8 regular track students from St. John Bosco and St. Kateri Tekakwitha would be located at the new Monsignor Paul Dwyer Catholic High School. This would include boundary adjustments related St. Joseph/Sir Albert Love and Sir Albert Love satellite area to St. John XXIII.
- 2. When the new replacement Dwyer secondary school is open, the Board will have a vacant building in Oshawa that could be used as a single-track grade 1-8 FI school. Or alternatively, the Board will also have a vacant building at Father Venini Catholic elementary school, which could also be used as a single-track grade 1-8 FI school. In this scenario the grade 7 and 8 regular track students from St. John Bosco and St. Anne would be located at the new Monsignor Paul Dwyer Catholic High School. This would include boundary adjustments related St. Joseph/Sir Albert Love and Sir Albert Love satellite area to St. John XXIII.
- 3. When the new replacement Dwyer secondary school is open, the Board will have a vacant building in Oshawa that could be used as a single-track grade 1-6 FI school. Or alternatively, the Board will also have a vacant building at Father Venini Catholic elementary school, which could also be used as a single-track grade 1-6 FI school. In this scenario the grade 7 and 8 FI students from St. Christopher and St. Kateri Tekakwitha would be located at the new Monsignor Paul Dwyer Catholic High School. This would include boundary adjustments related St. Joseph/Sir Albert Love and Sir Albert Love satellite area to St. John XXIII.

NEXT STEPS

Pending "In Principle" approval by the Board of Trustees of the recommendations outlined in this report as supported by the Watson and Associates study, staff would engage with the Oshawa family of schools to solicit input from the various communities to determine the option(s) that would provide the Board with an optimum recommendation(s) to implement in the Oshawa attendance areas.

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

Map of Existing Attendance Boundaries







Option 1: Assign 7-8s from St. John Bosco + St. Kateri Tekakwitha

- Reduces current enrolment pressures at St. John Bosco;
- Reduces <u>future</u> enrolment pressures at St. Kateri Tekakwitha from new developing growth (Kedron);
- With additional space at St. Kateri
 Tekakwitha, this site could be used as a
 holding zone for ALL new Kedron growth;
- Additional space at St. John Bosco would allow for a boundary change between St. Bosco and St. Anne to equalize enrolments:
- Additional capital required to accommodate enrolment from future growth (Can be accommodated through holding zones in the interim).

Option 2: Assign 7-8s from St. John Bosco + St. Anne


- Reduces current enrolment pressures at St. John Bosco;
- Reduces mid-term enrolment pressures at St. Anne;
- Additional capital required to accommodate enrolment from future growth (Can be accommodated through holding zones in the interim).


Option 3: Assign FI 7-8s residing in Oshawa to Msg. P. Dwyer C.H.S

- Reduces elementary (gr. 7/8) enrolment at Msgr. Dwyer C.H.S, allowing for additional classes to be used for the secondary panel where there are enrolment pressures.
- Additional capital required to accommodate enrolment from future growth (Can be accommodated through holding zones in the interim).

What's Next?

- If a single-track FI program is opened, excess space at St. Kateri Tekakwitha C.S. could be utilized as a holding zone for new school growth (Kedron);
- With holding zone growth assigned to St. Kateri Tekakwitha C.S. and 7/8s attending the new Dwyer, excess space at St. John Bosco C.S. opens up options to make a boundary change between St. Anne C.S./St. John Bosco C.S. to keep students who attend St. John Bosco C.S. but currently reside within St. Anne C.S.'s boundary.
- Potential for holding schools in the south if St. Kateri retains FI program and/or 7/8 English track students.
- Require students to attend home school (limit out of boundary).
- Assign Sir Albert Love C.S. students to Msgr. Pereyma for grade 9.
- Additional Capital to accommodate new growth.
